## Bio – Ani Waaka

Ani Waaka's working life started in Rotorua as a shorthand typist in a law firm.

Three years later she moved to Wellington to be Michael Hardie-Boys secretary in the law firm of Scott, Hardie-Boys, Morrison & Jefferies. She returned to Rotorua and spent 10 years in her original law firm, as a legal executive working initially in common law and then family law.

Returning to Wellington, Ani spent eight years in the legal team at the Ministry of Consumer Affairs during which time she took up a 2½ year secondment into Parliament as Consumer Affairs secretary to the Minister of Consumer Affairs.
